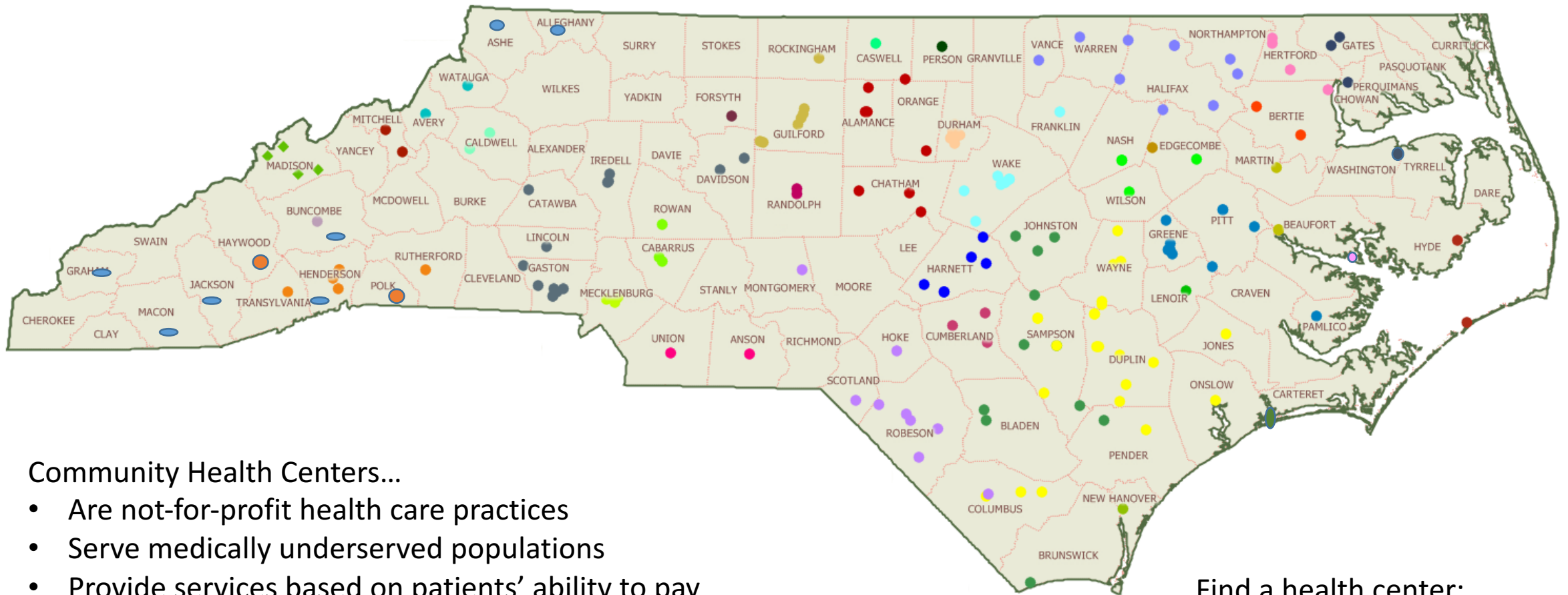

Community Health Centers...

- Are not-for-profit health care practices
- Serve medically underserved populations
- Provide services based on patients' ability to pay
- Are governed by a board, a majority of which must include health center patients
- Provide: primary medical care, dental care, behavioral/mental health care, pharmacy services, health insurance outreach & enrollment, enabling services (case management, health education, interpretation, WIC programs, transportation, etc.)
